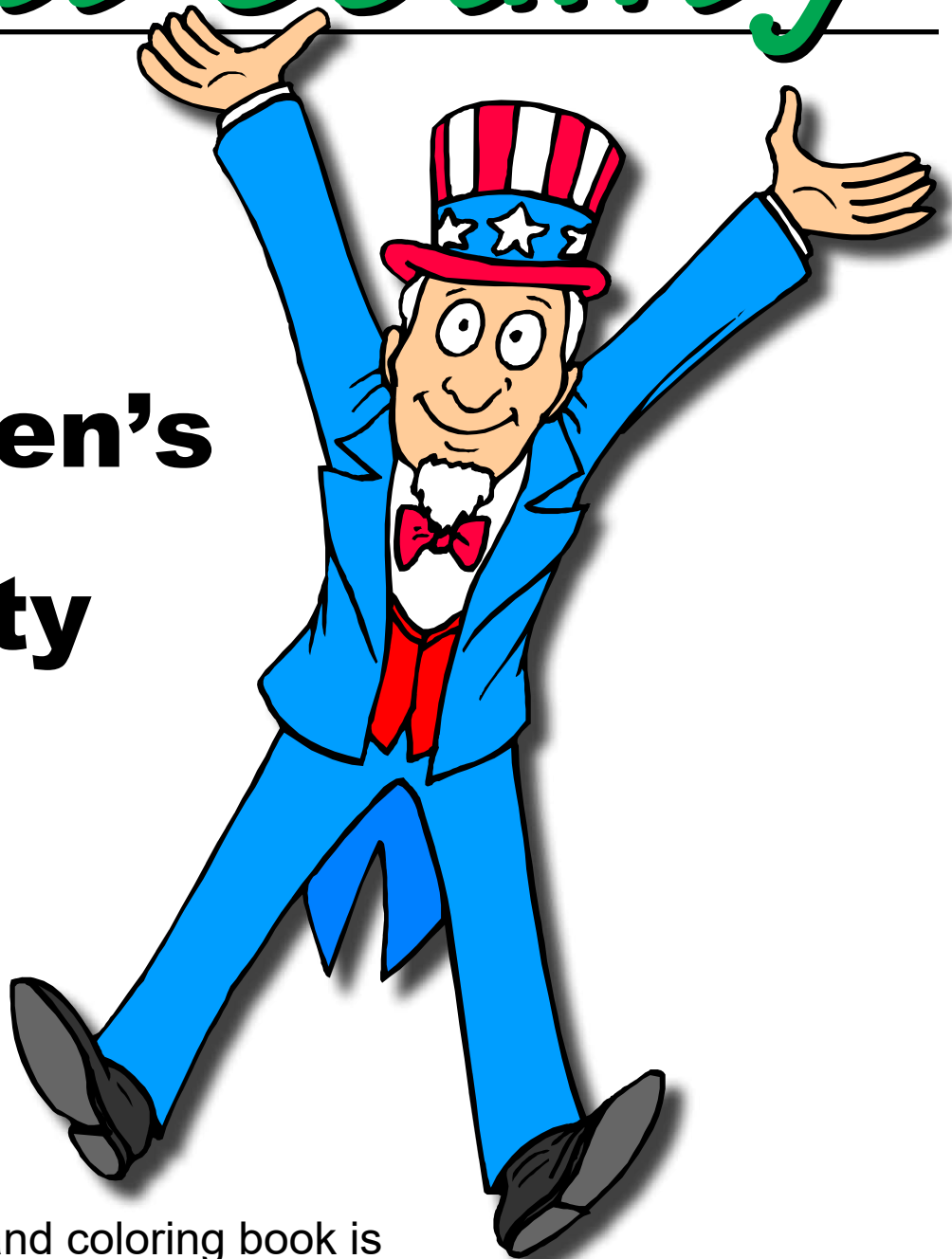

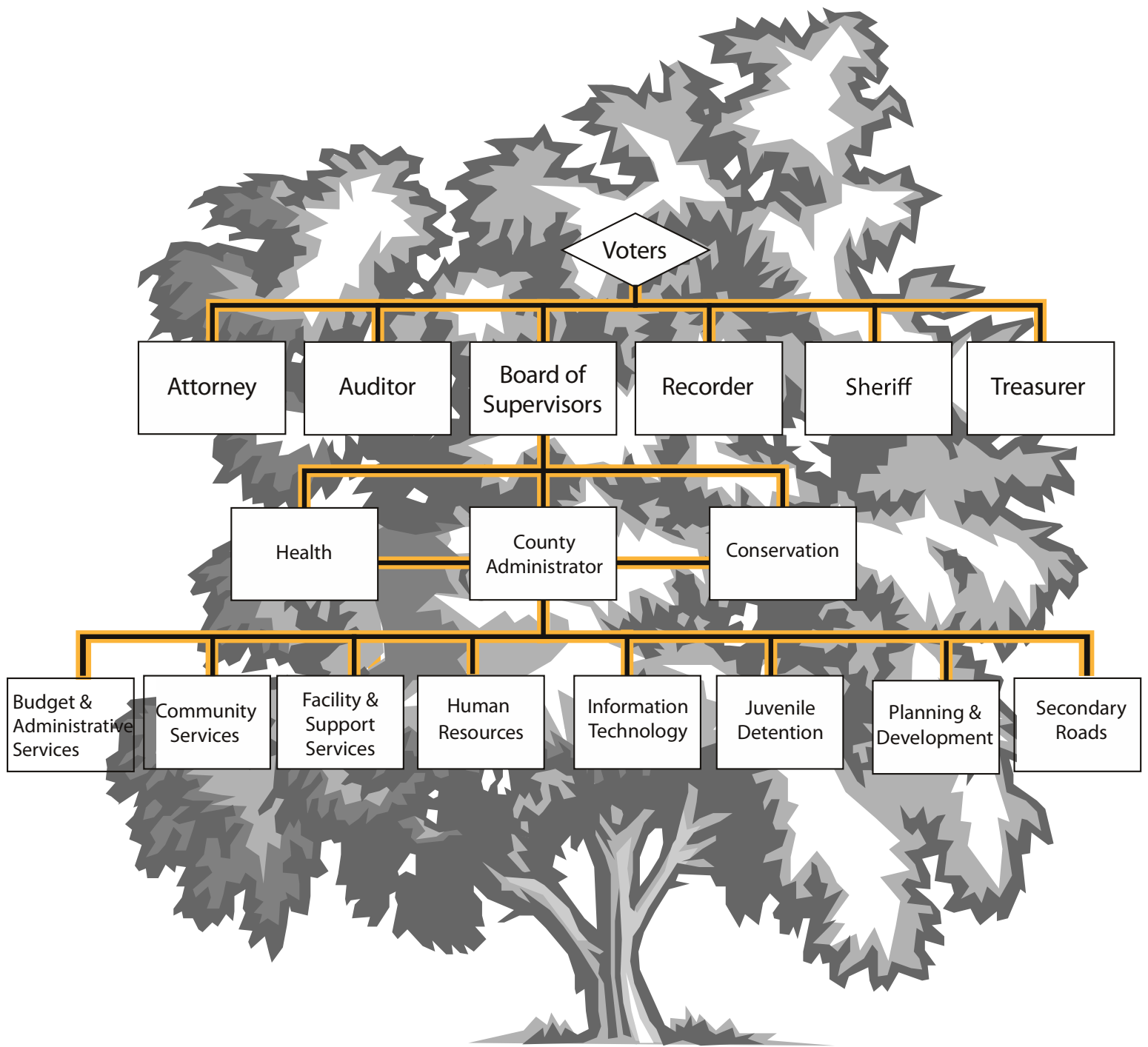

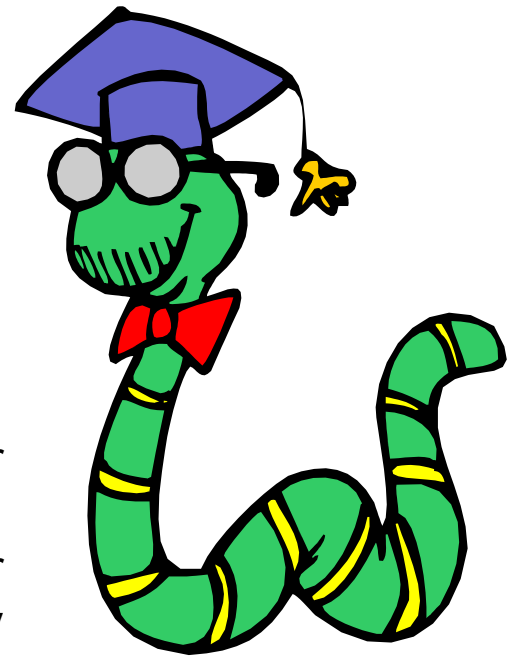
When Jeremy had a free hour in school the next day he went to the school library and asked the librarian , Mrs. Screech, where he could find information on the history of the county. Mrs. Screech took him to the “S” shelf and together they found many books on the history of Scott County.



The first thing he learned was Scott County turned 175 years old on December 2012, older than his parents, even older than old Mrs. Screech! He also found out that once there were enough new settlers in the area that they decided to form a government so that there would be rules and roads. A man named Antoine LeClaire gave the county a piece of land in Davenport and the first courthouse was built. The current building is the latest in what will be many courthouses.

Jeremy also learned Scott County government is comprised of many offices and departments

that perform specific tasks. The Conservation Department runs big parks with lakes and golf courses and the Health Department makes sure the food we eat at restaurants is clean. The county also has a sheriff who arrests lawbreakers and puts them in the county jail to wait for their trial. Jeremy found out that when he was old enough he could vote in elections put on by the County Auditor and that his cars could drive on county highways maintained by the County Engineer and have license plates issued by the County Treasurer. He learned the County Community Services helps poor people. He was amazed at how much a county does.

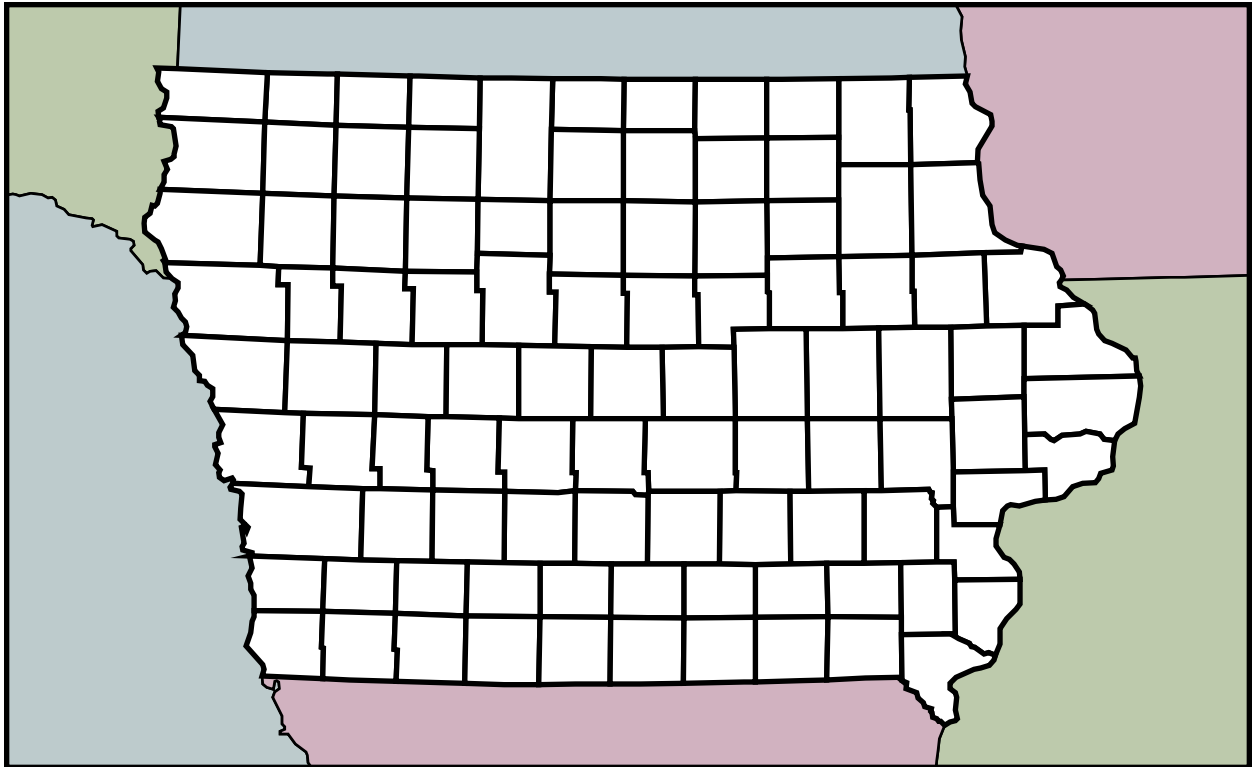

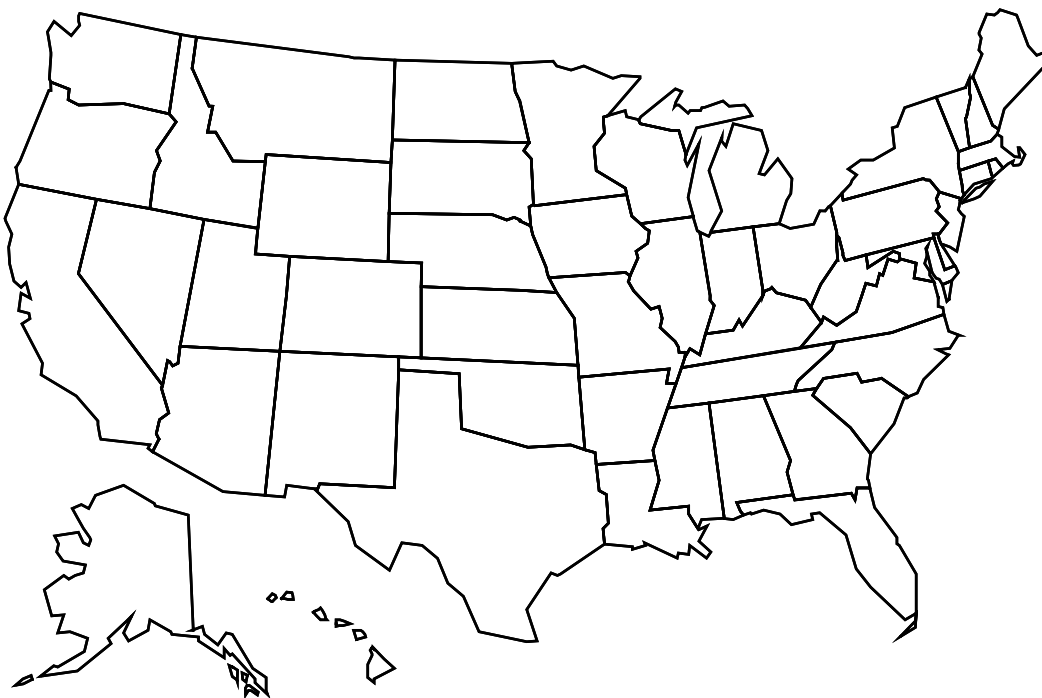


Geography

Where is Scott County within the State of Iowa? Color red where you think Scott County is.

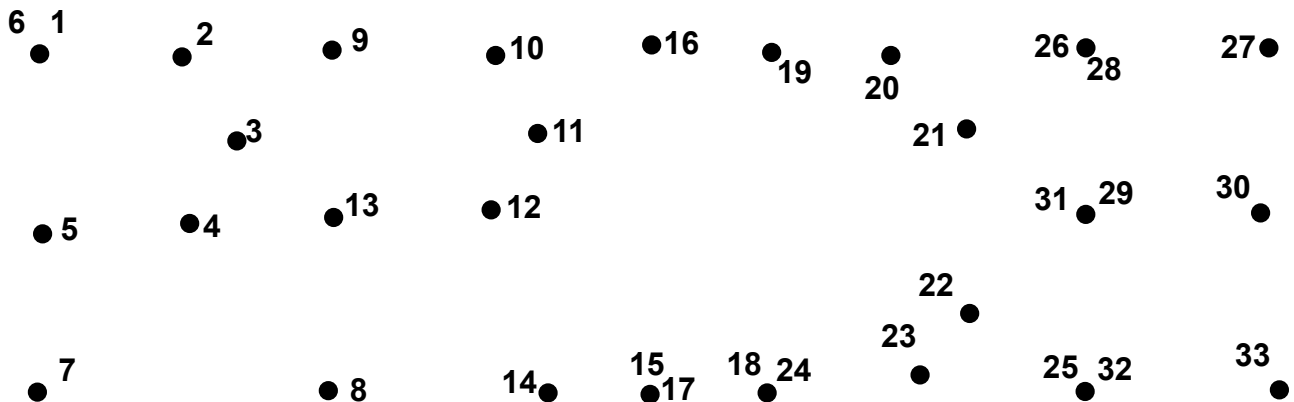


The Quad Cities are located in two states; Iowa and Illinois. Can you color Iowa green and Illinois blue? Can you identify other states?

Connect the dots in the dot-to-dot puzzle and see what appears. Some dots are used for more than one number.



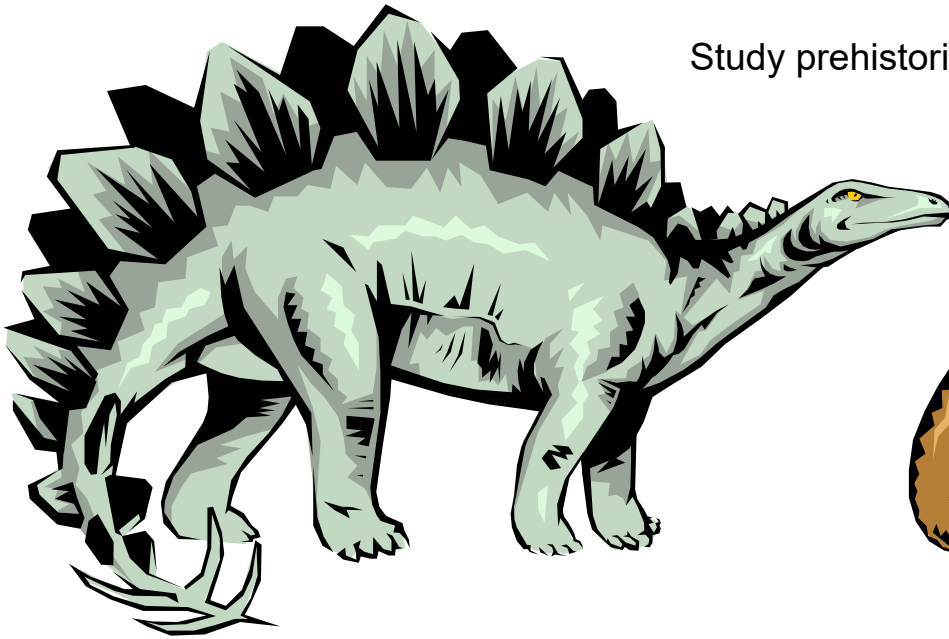
The Scott County slogan is PRIDE. The letters in PRIDE stand for

- Excellence.

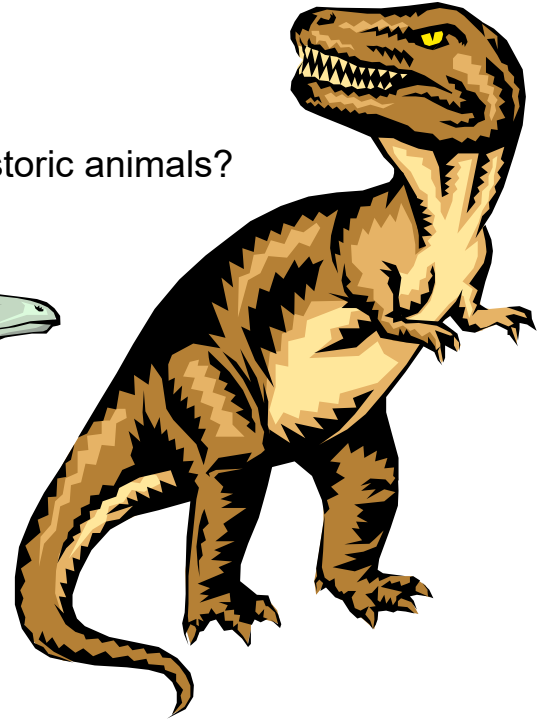
The employees who work for Scott County try to use these five things each day so that you, your family and friends will get the best possible service out of your County government.

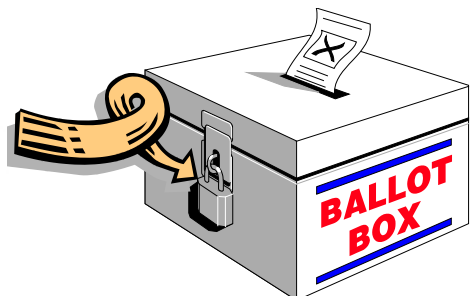
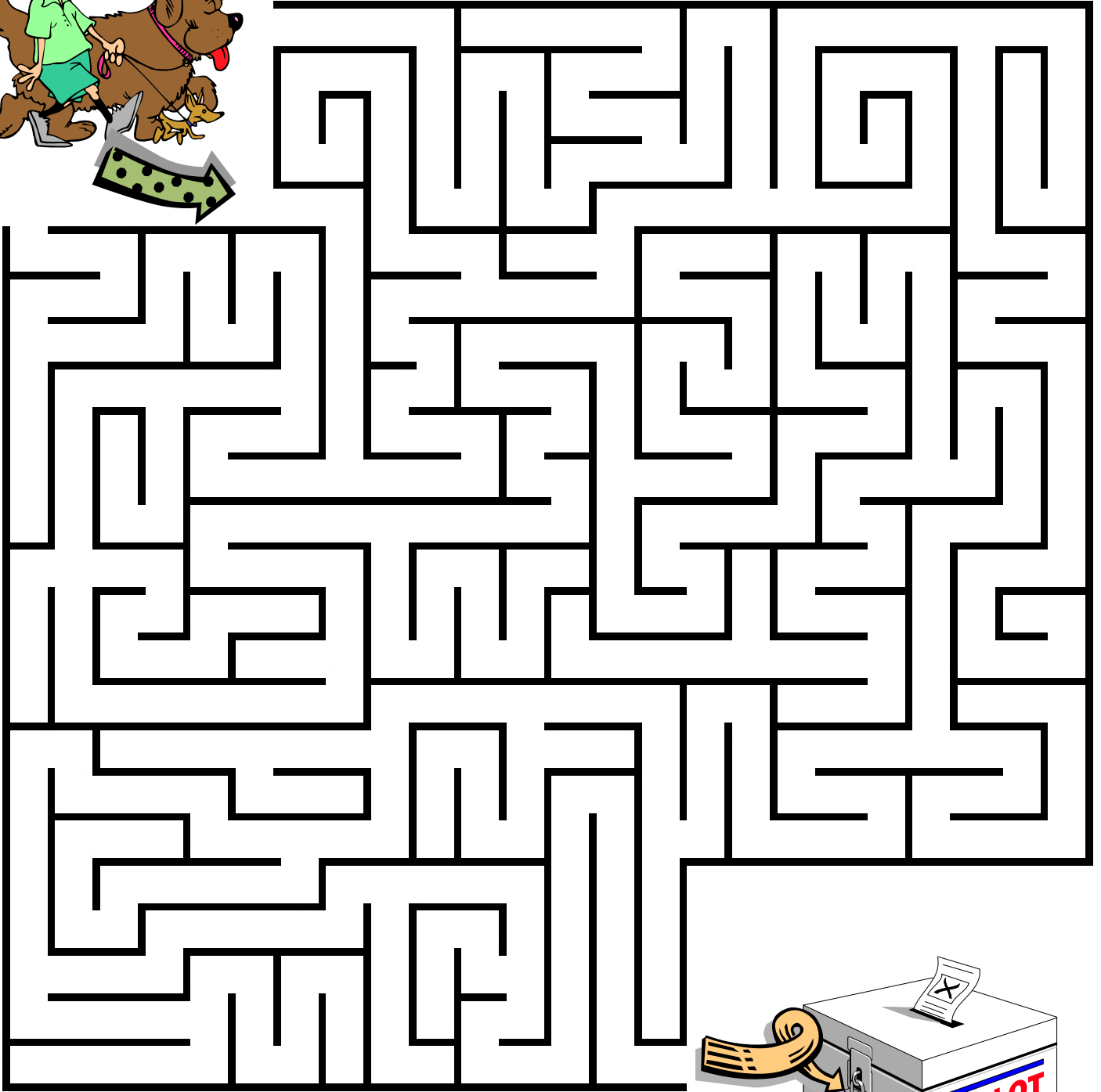
Go to court?



The County Attorney goes to court when people break criminal and County laws. They give legal help to the Board of Supervisors and County Officers about County matters. They go to court for all juvenile delinquency and children in need of help cases.

Board of Supervisors

The Scott County Board of Supervisors approve the laws which govern Scott County. The Board consists of five members who are elected by your parents and all the other adults in Scott County who go out and vote in the election.

The Board of Supervisors hires a County Administrator who oversees the day-to-day operation of the appointed County department heads. The County Administrator also works with the elected department heads to make sure the County runs smoothly.

The wordfind below gives you some idea of the different people and things which go into running a County. While these people and things are very important, there are many other people and things which make the County operate smoothly.

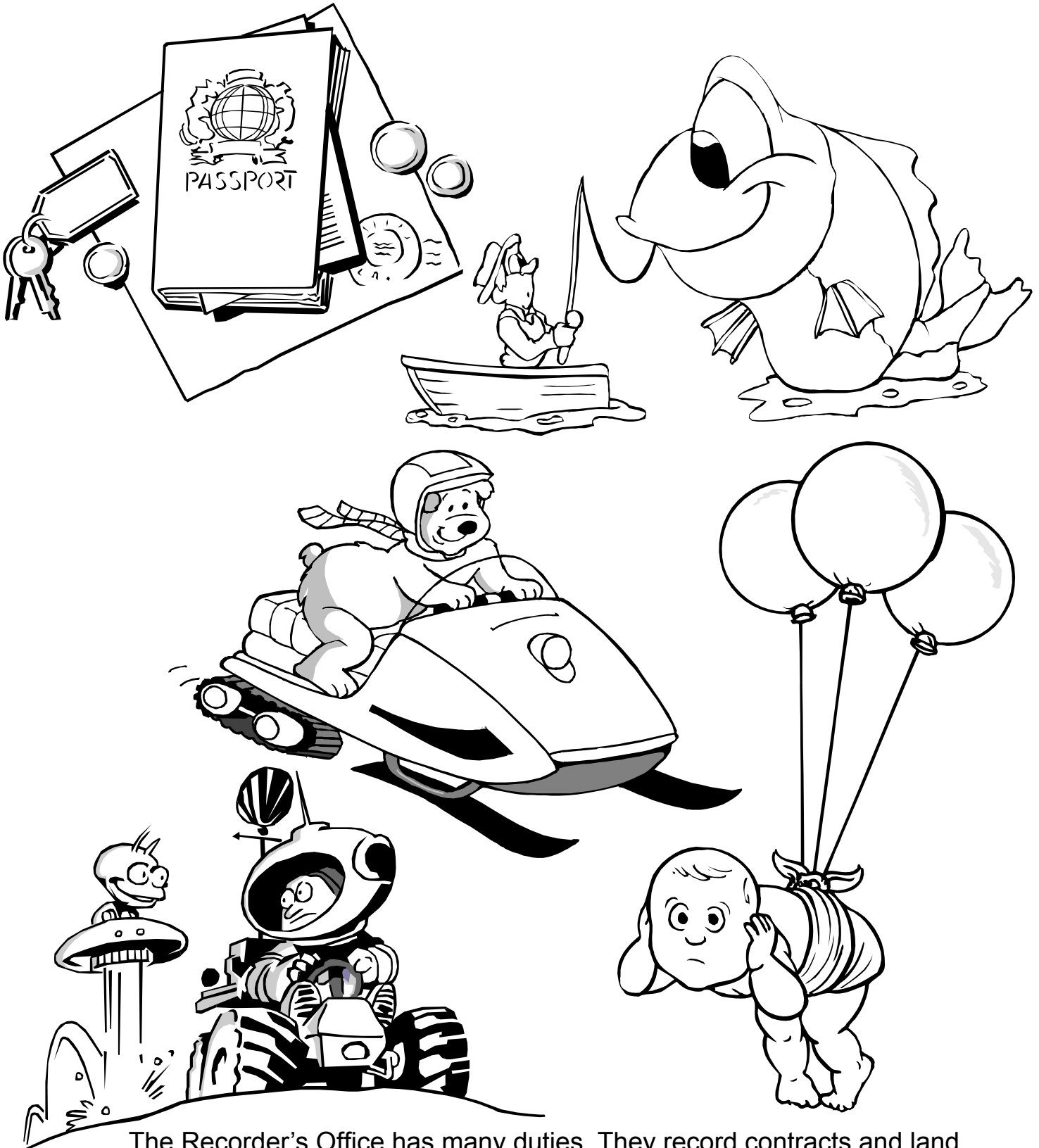

Circle the picture that doesn't belong in the Recorder's Office. Color the ones that belong.

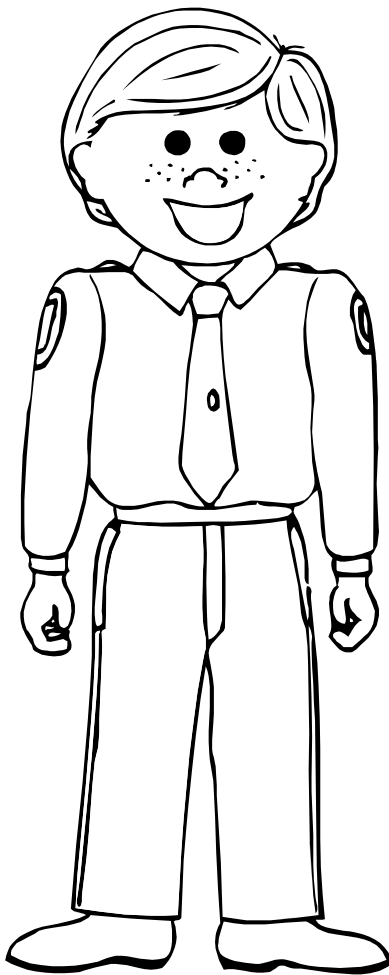

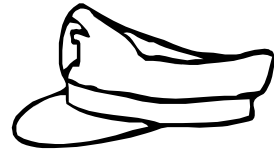
Sheriff's Office

Pretend that you're a Scott County Sheriff's Deputy. What would you wear?

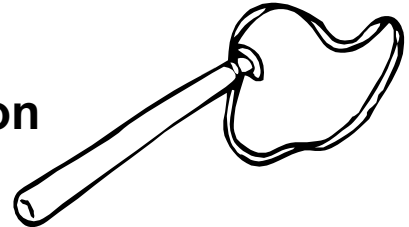

The County Treasurer collects taxes from your parents to pay for your school, city and county government. The Treasurer also registers cars and trucks and gives out license plates.

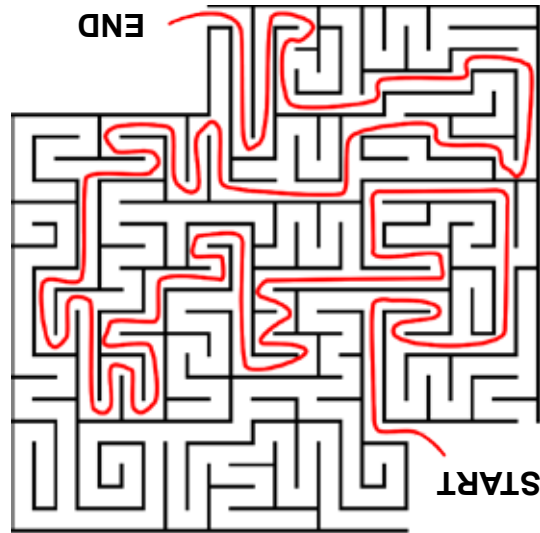

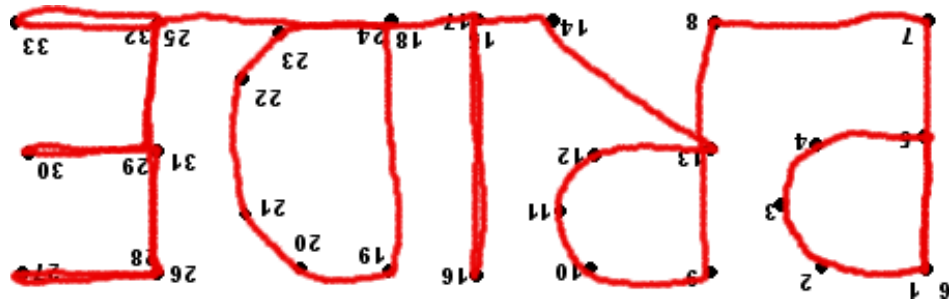
