SCOTT COUNTY BUDGET

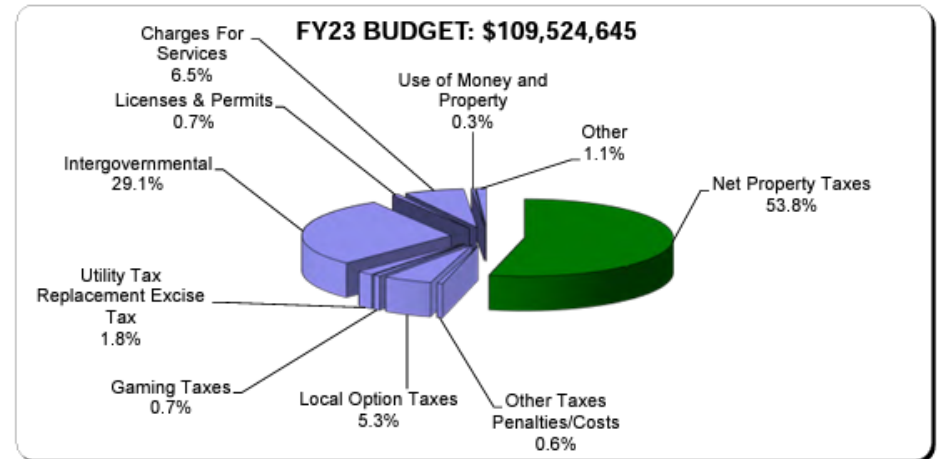

For FY23, Scott County's property rate was the 5th lowest urban and the 2nd lowest rural of the eight largest counties.

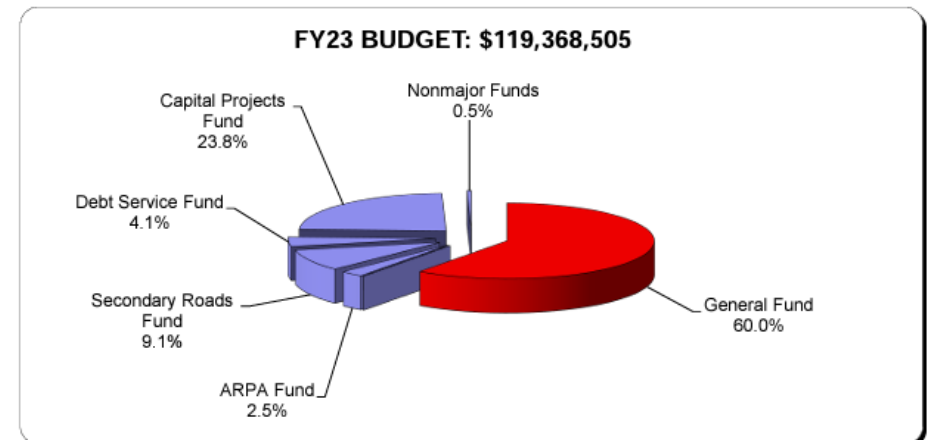


SCOTT COUNTY GOALS
