Scott County Auditor:

Thank you for the continued investment in the Iowa State Association of Counties (ISAC). As you know, ISAC represents and serves Iowa's 99 counties through government advocacy, education, programs, and services, as the principal, authoritative source of information for county government in Iowa.

This summer marks one year as Executive Director, and it has been a fulfilling year. I have spent a significant amount of my time getting to know the ISAC staff, ISAC Board Members, and the 16 Affiliate organizations. We will be kicking off the 99-county tour in July, and we are eager for your feedback as we travel the state. We can't wait!

In the meantime, it is that time of year – the annual request for dues to ensure your county can access all ISAC programs and services. Attached you will find a dues statement for FY 2026. Dues remain unchanged from FY 2025.

In addition to seeing us as part of the 99-county tour, we have an additional request. In November 2024, ISAC membership approved an amendment to the Articles of Incorporation to position the organization for an updated tax status with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). To clarify to the IRS that it is the counties that control, act, and vote on ISAC matters, the Articles of Incorporation were amended to have the boards of supervisors designate voting delegates through a resolution. The voting delegates remain the same as before, which are all elected officials and the principal officer for each county department represented by an Affiliated Association of ISAC. As required by our Articles of Incorporation, we are requesting an approved resolution of the voting delegates for your county.

An email will be sent in the coming weeks with a draft resolution, instructions, and deadline. While this updated process will require a new step, we are hopeful this will encourage more engagement in ISAC and in time for voting on the ISAC Legislative Priorities this fall.
