Access to Care	
Uninsured children	0.9%
Uninsured (18-64)	6.2%
Difficulties accessing healthcare services in last year (adults under age 65)	37.3%
Barriers to access have prevented adult's medical care in the past year:	
<i>Getting a doctor's appointment</i>	16.5%
<i>Inconvenient office hours</i>	14.1%
<i>Cost of prescriptions</i>	12.3%
