
Learning Objectives

By the end of the program, participants should be able to:

- 1. Build community partnerships to support health preparedness, and be integrated into the jurisdictions' all-hazards emergency plans;
- 2. Identify and engage community partners in response to foster public health, medical and mental/behavioral health, in a community before, during, and after an incident;
- 3. Identify issues and plan for functional needs populations during emergencies;
- 4. Determine risks to the health of the jurisdiction by identifying potential hazards, vulnerabilities, and risks in the community infrastructure;
- 5. Increase their knowledge and ability to work collaboratively to prepare for, withstand, and recover from public health incidents;
- 6. Develop, coordinate and disseminate information, alerts, warnings and notifications specific to incident type;
- 7. Notify and assemble key public information personnel to provide information to the public during and after an incident;
- 8. Identify businesses and not-for profit agencies whom serve the community, including vulnerable populations, and work together to plan, respond, and recover from disasters;
- 9. Identify ways to incorporate the National Weather Service into your planning;
- 10. Understand the importance of critical incident stress management;
- 11. Explain how current trends in healthcare are causing programs associated with preventing disease overlap;
- 12. Define the roles of Biosafety and Infection Prevention professionals;
- 13. Summarize lessons learned from diseases of high consequence; and
- 14. Identify issues and Stumbling blocks associated with real time public information messaging during emergencies.


