

# Color Create-It Kits: Green Week

These kits are provided at all Scott County Library branches while supplies last. If you were unable to pick up a kit, create your own at-home version using these instructions.

## Rock Succulent

Ages  
Kids 7+,  
Teen &  
Adult

You will need:

- small terra cotta pot
- small stones
- wooden egg
- green acrylic paint
- small square of pink felt
- glue
- paint brush
- black marker
- scissors




1. Paint egg with green paint.
2. Tear off a small part of your paper bag and bunch it up. Place in bottom of pot.
3. When egg is dry, use black marker to make texture lines, like a cactus.
4. Cut a small flower out of pink felt and glue to top of rock.
5. Hold egg upright in pot and arrange rocks around it to hold it in place.

## Edible Soil Layers

Ages  
Kids  
2-7

You will need:

- clear cup
- butterscotch chips
- chocolate chips
- chocolate pudding
- 2 oreos
- green sprinkles
- 2 gummy worms
- spoon
- marker to label layers



1. Start with your parent material of chocolate chips and butterscotch chips. (see photo for layers).
2. Add pudding for subsoil.
3. Crush and add your Oreos for the topsoil.
4. Use green sprinkles as organic material.
5. Add your worms and enjoy!

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## Nature Sensory Bottle

Ages  
Kids 3-12



### You will need:

- clear bottle with cap
- water
- fresh flowers and leaves
- artificial flowers and leaves
- Optional: glitter, hot glue, clear school glue or baby oil

1. Gather fresh flower petals, leaves, and other bits of nature.
2. Fill bottle halfway with clear school glue or baby oil (if using).
3. Add found flowers and the fake flowers to the bottle.
4. Add glitter if using.
5. Fill bottle to about an inch from the top with water.
6. Tighten lid (use hot glue to secure).

## Nature Crown

Ages  
Kids 3-7



### You will need:

- brown paper lunch bag
- cardstock
- scissors
- tape
- glue or hot glue
- items from nature

1. Keep your paper bag handy for this one! You will use this as the band for the crown.
2. Measure the circumference of your child's head to see how long your piece of paper bag needs to be.
3. Cut long strips that are each 2" tall.
4. Tape the strips into a circle shape with masking tape.
5. Next, gather things from nature to add to the crown.
6. Trace and then cut out a crown from the cardstock. Glue your items to it.
7. Attach the crown to your band and wear!
