

Color Create-It Kits: Rainbow Week

These kits are provided at all Scott County Library branches while supplies last. If you were unable to pick up a kit, create your own at-home version using these instructions.



Rainbow Hoop Craft

Ages
Kids 7+,
Teens,
Adults

You will need:

- small wooden hoop
- ribbon in rainbow colors
- embroidery thread
- markers (optional)

1. Tie the ribbons to the hoop with a double knot. Use any color order, but think ROYGBIV if you want a rainbow.
2. Tie a knot with one color of embroidery thread and then wrap randomly across the hoop.
3. Repeat with the other color of embroidery thread, but leave a enough length free at the top to hang your hoop.
4. Use markers to decorate wooden hoop, if desired.
5. Hang up and enjoy your rainbow hoop decoration!



Confetti Bookmark

Ages
Kids 7+,
Teens,
Adults

You will need:

- confetti
- plastic treat bag with adhesive top
- ribbon
- hole punch
- scrapbook paper (optional)
- permanent markers (optional)

1. Fill the long plastic bag (your bookmark!) with confetti.
2. Tear strips of paper and add to bag.
3. Add scrapbook paper as a background, if desired.
4. Fold and seal bookmark.
5. Use permanent markers to decorate outside of bag, if desired.
6. Decorate white sticker and place on outside of bag.
7. Punch a hole at the top of the bookmark (make sure it is above the seal) and tie ribbons.



Popsicle Rainbow

Ages
Kids 7+ or
younger
with adult
help

You will need:

- white & pink felt
- 7 popsicle sticks
- googly eyes
- small length of yarn
- glue stick & tape
- markers, crayons, or paint

1. Cut a cloud from the white felt and 2 small circles from the pink felt
2. Peel the sticky back from the googly eyes and add to the cloud.
3. Glue the pink circles to the cloud as cheeks
4. Glue the black string to the cloud as a mouth--use whatever shape you would like
5. Color each popsicle stick a color of the rainbow
6. Place the popsicle sticks in a row, but at staggered heights. Tape together across the back, about mid height, for extra stability.
7. Glue the popsicle stick row to the back of the cloud
8. You're done!



Sand Art

Ages
Kids 5+ or
younger
with adult
help

You will need:

- A box or surface that can get sandy/messy!
- sand in various colors
- a plastic or glass container with a lid
- a small funnel

1. Remove cap from your necklace or container.
2. Pick a color sand and use your funnel to begin filling your necklace or container.
3. Use a different color sand to create another layer.
4. Repeat using different color sand to create layers until you reach the top.
5. Replace the cap on your necklace and wear! Be sure not to shake it or your colors will all mix!

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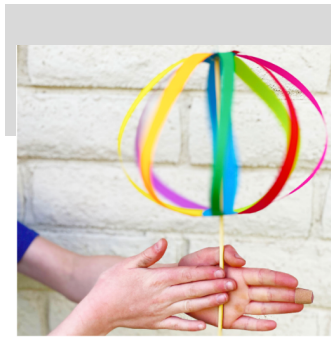
Sand Art

You will need:

- box or surface that can get sandy/messy!
- glass or plastic bottle with a cork lid
- sand in a variety of colors
- small funnel
- mini seashells or other decorations
- ribbon (optional)

1. Remove cork from your bottle.
2. Pick a color sand and use your funnel to begin filling your bottle.
3. Use a different color sand to create another layer.
4. Repeat using different color sand to create layers until the sand is all used.
5. Add a layer of seashells.
6. Replace the cork on your bottle. Add ribbon if desired and display! Be sure not to shake it or your colors will all mix!



Twirligig Spinner

**Ages
Kids 8+ or
younger
with adult
help**

You will need:

- wooden skewer (about 12 in)
- 8 strips of paper in various colors (1/2 in wide, 11 in long)
- 4 paper circles (1 in diameter)
- glue stick
- pin (optional)
- hot glue (recommended)
- or tape



1. Spread glue from a glue stick all over one of the circles.
2. Arrange one end of each paper strip evenly around the circle. Keep adding glue as they overlap around the circle.
3. Cover the top with another circle to secure them in place.
4. Repeat with another circle, using the other ends of the paper strips.
5. Put the wooden skewer through the center of both circles of paper. Use a pin to start the hole, then pushed the pointy end of the skewer up through the center.
6. On the top circle, cover the top with hot glue to keep it from moving. Repeat on the under side of the same circle.
7. Move the skewer around in the bottom hole to make it a little wider.
8. You're ready to play! Roll the stick between both hands and watch it twirl!
