The Winnebago County Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) presents the 19th Annual Midwest Emergency Preparedness and Response Conference (MEPRC). Also featured, at no additional cost, is an eight-hour USDOL/OSHA, 29 CFR §1910.120 "Hazwoper" Refresher Training.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Those who would benefit include: Employees of industries subject to SARA Title III and Clean Air Act Section 112R, Hazardous Materials Handlers, Emergency Response Clean-up Personnel, Health Departments, Emergency Responders, Police and Fire Service, Physicians and Nurses, Education / Security professionals, citizen groups and Local Emergency Planning Committee members plus anyone wanting to take the USDOL/OSHA 29 CFR §1910.120 "Hazwoper" Annual Refresher training .

WHAT YOU GET

Your registration fee provides admission to all sessions each day and includes any demonstrations as well as breakfast and lunch on April 19th along with breakfast on April 20, 2017. You must register before being admitted to any Midwest Emergency Preparedness and Response Conference (MEPRC) function, and entry to the event will only be permitted by having/displaying an MEPRC badge.

PROGRAM LEARNING OBJECTIVES

At the completion of the conference, the participants will have a better understanding of important changes in emergency management through their training experience and the regulatory updates. This will include updates from IEMA as well as environmental health and safety issues. Transportation experts will cover safety, preparedness and planning issues relating to pipelines, and an expert from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) will discuss Complex Coordinated Attacks followed by another emergency management expert discussing lessons learned from the West Texas Fertilizer Plant Explosion, and the conference will culminate with a Tabletop Drill for a Pipeline Incident involving Flammable Liquids to Increase awareness of response actions needed. This drill will meet the criteria for an annual exercise/simulation for LEPC Plans as long as a copy of their local LEPC Plan is used and exercised. Emergency Management Agencies will also receive credit from IEMA for participation in the tabletop exercise/simulation.

BENEFITS TO PARTICIPANTS

Registrants from all target groups will receive the latest information to conduct their activities safely, in compliance with current standards and laws, provide awareness and preparation for emergency events, fulfill other training and response requirements for OSHA, 29 CFR §1910.120 refresher training.
